#### Stonewall, October 2023

The Ace in the UK Report uncovers the experiences of healthcare, workplace and societal discrimination that asexual people face in the UK, and the need for better protections.

#### Trans hate crime rises 11% in past year in England and Wales

#### BBC News, on <u>Home Office statistics</u>, October 2023

Recorded hate crimes against transgender people in England and Wales rose 11% to 4,732 offences in the last year, according to Home Office figures. All other groups for which hate crime data is recorded saw a drop over the same period.

# Gender identity and eating disorders: clinician's perceptions of care for transgender and gender diverse patients

#### The Mental Elf, October 2023

Research has identified that the occurrence of EDs is higher amongst transgender and gender diverse individuals, yet research has largely focused on white cisgender girls and women. This study explored healthcare providers' views around the access to care and treatment within ED services for transgender and gender diverse individuals, with a focus on facilitators and barriers to care.

#### Aging with Pride: Innovations in Dementia Empowerment and Action (IDEA)

#### **Contemporary Clinical Trials Communication, October 2023**

Sexual and gender minority (SGM) older adults and their care partners face unique vulnerabilities that exacerbate living with dementia, including elevated disparities in comorbidities, social isolation, and structural inequities, such as discrimination and lack of access to supports. This paper describes the virtual adaptation process of the first-ever randomized controlled clinical trial intervention, IDEA, designed for SGM older adults living with dementia and their care partners.

Disclosure and Help-Seeking Experiences of Sexual and Gender Minority Victims of Intimate Partner Violence: A Mixed-Methods Study [email <u>library.lincoln@ulh.nhs.uk</u> for full article] Journal of Interpersonal Violence, October 2023

Sexual and gender minorities assigned female at birth (SGM-AFAB) experience high rates of intimate partner violence (IPV), with negative effects on health and well-being. Disclosure of and help-seeking for IPV can support the well-being of IPV survivors, yet are understudied among SGM-AFAB people.





Discrimination, gender dysphoria, drinking to cope, and alcohol harms in the UK trans and nonbinary community [email <u>library.lincoln@ulh.nhs.uk</u> for full article]

#### Alcohol and Alcoholism, October 2023

Trans and non-binary people may be at increased risk of alcohol harms, but little is known about motives for drinking in this community. This study explored the relationship between risk of alcohol dependence, experience of alcohol harms, drinking motives, dysphoria, and discrimination within a UK sample of trans and non-binary people.

Few studies have addressed student perceptions of or receptiveness towards transgender health education. The study purpose was to explore student perceptions of transgender health education.
