#### **Black British Voices: The Findings**

This is the largest survey to date of the opinions and attitudes of Black people in Britain. The <u>report from the University of Cambridge</u> reveals that extremely high levels of distrust and discrimination are still felt deeply across Black British communities when it comes to systems such as health, education and criminal justice.

#### Ethnic inequalities in Improving Access to Psychological Therapies (IAPT)

This <u>review of ethnic inequalities in the Improving Access to Psychological Therapies (IAPT) programme</u> <u>from the NHS Race & Health Observatory</u> tells a story of some progress and improved outcomes for minoritised ethnic groups, but with continued inequalities including between different minoritised ethnic groups.

# Ethnic inequalities in mortality in England: a complex picture requiring tailored, evidence-based responses

The <u>findings from this King's Fund report</u> confirm earlier reports that people from ethnic minority groups, especially Black African and Chinese groups, have lower overall mortality than the White British group, often attributed to the 'healthy migrant effect'. Beneath these headline figures, the data shows highly diverse patterns by ethnicity and health condition. There is further confirmation that, compared with the White British, South Asian but not Black groups experience high mortality from heart disease, and the reverse is seen for prostate cancer. Mortality from hypertension and diabetes (and chronic kidney disease that often results from diabetes), on the other hand, is high in both South Asian and Black groups. There





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are also differences between South Asian sub-groups, with Bangladeshi and Pakistani groups, but not Indians, having the highest mortality rates for many individual conditions, including Covid-19.

#### Fact sheet: Muslim mental health

Research suggests that Muslims face some of the greatest mental health inequalities, yet too many encounter significant barriers to support. This <u>fact sheet</u>, <u>developed in partnership with the Woolf Institute</u>, brings together the latest available evidence on Muslim mental health across the life course.

#### The challenges ethnic minority groups face, and the changes we must see

<u>Healthwatch share the key trends</u> in what people from different ethnic minority groups are telling them, and propose steps the NHS can take towards equity in care.

#### **Workplace Hair Acceptance Report**

This <u>report for World Afro Day in September</u> examines the issue of Afro hair discrimination in the workplace and the understanding of this problem, particularly focused on the Employer. There has been extensive research and evidence quantifying Afro hair discrimination from the victim perspective. This report will consider ways in which employers can eliminate Afro hair discrimination and what legal intervention might be needed.

# An insight into the experiences of Black and Minority Ethnic nurses within healthcare: a narrative literature review

This review from researchers at Manchester Metropolitan University has revealed the first-hand experiences of the issues faced by BMN in their workplaces and recommended ways to abolish the issues. Implication for Nursing Policy Zero tolerance for discrimination and reported cases of discrimination should be swiftly dealt with.
